- Strengthen existing partnership working to develop a sustainable self -improving schools' system.
- Focus our work together on:

 - Further Improving the wellbeing of our young people

- These strategic goals will be addressed through our Trust Action Plan which will be based on regular audits of strengths and areas for development across the schools.
- We believe that the values of a co-operative schools' trust match our existing values but also enables us to be part of a wider national network of schools with complimentary values. This ensures we are outward looking, in our drive to make all our local schools the very best they can be for the young people of the Northfleet and surrounding area

4. Trust Forum
